

CCTV'S VALUES

Democracy and the First Amendment

All people in a democracy have the right and responsibility to take part in the decisions that affect them and their communities. Freedom of speech is vital to a healthy democracy and is guaranteed in the First Amendment. CCTV provides the community with the opportunity for political, cultural, artistic, spiritual, and individual expression on television.

Community Decision-Making

Freedom of expression alone is not enough to ensure a healthy democracy. Citizens must also enter into active discussion and debate in order to participate in solving problems for the common good. CCTV promotes the use of noncommercial channels 21, 22, 23 and production facilities as an electronic forum for discussing issues and solving problems.

Access to Information

A well-informed, actively-involved citizenry makes more responsible decisions. CCTV televises local government meetings, activities of local schools and service-related information to stimulate an active dialogue among elected officials, schools and local citizens.

Diversity and Inclusiveness

Democracy is most effective in a society in which all members can participate. CCTV encourages understanding and collaboration across barriers of race, culture, language, class, gender and age.

Media Literacy

Community TV offers an alternative to commercial television. CCTV provides the training and tools necessary for people to become knowledgeable and effective communicators, able to view television critically and to use that medium to tell their own stories.

Executive Director's Report

When CCTV was awarded the Alliance for Community Media Overall Excellence for combined Public, Educational and Government (PEG) Access programming, that award capped the incredible year of 2008-2009 that is impossible to top. We moved into a terrific new center, hosted a regional conference and joined our colleagues 50 miles to the north in hosting a national conference.

While 2009-2010 was not as flashy, we made progress. We adapted to operate a much larger center with the same number of staff. Working with the City of Salem, we secured the Trade Street loading zone, tweaked the HVAC system, installed an automatic front door opener, learned the neighborhood and routed people to Travel Salem.

We encountered problems, the worst being the amount of sound entering and exiting the studios. The City of Salem elevated Salem IT's Liebert cooling units one floor above into spring-mounted boxes, solving incoming noise; we continue our work on sound reduction.

We began conversion to HD. Our plan to replace the oldest, worst condition equipment was turned upside down when our camcorders, among the newest equipment, began failing. The replacements are excellent, and do not require videotape. We also delayed a much-needed HD truck purchase as we awaited changes in cameras and the availability of longer length fiber-copper hybrid cables.



We wish all the best for Steve Hande as he recovers from a severe injury sustained in an early January automobile accident. We again realize how lucky we have been to have had his awesome help and how much everyone else had to step up in his absence. We truly admire Steve's courage and his daughter Stef's tireless work. We hope that Steve is soon back in the saddle and able to enjoy the life that he deserves.

Finally, we continue work with the Cable Regulatory Commission on our next cable TV franchise. Comcast pays for the invaluable use of public rights-of-way to reach cable subscribers, including the capital funds paying the building loan and buying HD equipment. Our community also needs HD channels with the same capability as out-of-town commercial channels, and we need our channels in the neighborhood of the Portland broadcast stations that after CCTV, are those closest to Salem.

We at CCTV have great Board members, staff, volunteers, local producers and program providers. We have excellent working partnerships with the City of Salem, Marion County, Salem-Keizer Schools and approximately 200 community organizations. We look forward to a great future as we build on our move to 575 Trade Street and with our move into an HD and online future.

MOVING INTO THE HD FRONTIER

The year 2010 marked the transition to high def for CCTV. The Panasonic HMC-40 camcorders were chosen to replace our aging mini-DV standard definition cameras. First, we asked producers what was important to them when selecting a camera. We found most were concerned with great image quality, sound quality, ease of use and that they be modest in weight. After a lot of research and having demos of several cameras we found the Panasonic to be the best pick. The camera has the right mix of professional features and ease of use.

Just as significant as the move to HD is the move away from tape-based formats. For over 20 years CCTV has used some form of tape to capture video. The new cameras use a small SDHC (Secure Digital High Capacity) card for recording. The editing process has also changed. Now you drag and drop files rather than shuttling back and forth to find and capture your images. Our community producers are very happy with the new cameras and say that the workflow is higher quality and easier than before. Ultimately, what's important is that our community producers have great gear to make programs that are important to them and then be able to share these with their local community.





Archives CCTV

CCTV Archives Grows and Goes Electronic

Last year we boasted of having over 3400 program archives in our library. Now we have over 4000 and growing! Why? Two words..John Piper. Volunteer John Piper has done an amazing job sorting through 20 years of old VHS archives and archiving programs to DVD.


Now included in our archive database are hundreds of school sports, music and community programs from the 1990s that are available for viewing and purchase.

Another stride forward in archiving came as a result of purchasing and implementing a new Drobo Raid system. The Drobos allow us to save all DVD archives into digital files with a storage capacity of 32TB on two Raids.

Because of Mike Wilhelm's ingenuity we were able to load 4000 DVD archives into the Drobos in only a few months by using six computers at once! Now staff are able to view and copy all archives on their own computers via our shared network.

In addition, Heide Kizer worked to update and uniform electronic and physical archive folders, files and boxes for easier archival searches. Currently, there are 40 boxes of DVD archives grouped by category and date.





along with a little information about the difference between commercial television and community television. Many groups also take advantage of our offer to create a short video message about their group!



Non-Profit Center Expands, Meets Social **Networking Needs**

Social networking, with its challenges and rewards, quickly evolved into a necessary outreach tool and CCTV is helping non-profits use it effectively. After a successful launch in 2008, CCTV's Non-Profit Center added more than a dozen video brochures in the fiscal year, many in English and Spanish. The brochures are featured on CCTV channels 21 and 23, as videos on individual web pages within CCTV's Non-Profit Center and now on CCTV's YouTube channel, where they can neuter clinic at Willamette easily be linked to web and social networking sites. Area non-profits are taking advantage of this 3-way outreach.

"We greatly appreciate the work that CCTV staff producer Wendy Brokaw put into creating a video brochure for us," says Kara Kuh, Willamette Humane Society's Communication Specialist. "The brochure is upbeat, positive, and easily conveys who we are and what kinds of resources we offer our community. We have a link to the brochure posted on our own website and YouTube, and staff can use it as an educational tool when they're talking about Willamette Humane out in the community. As a nonprofit with a limited marketing budget, it is really helpful that CCTV offers this great tool to help us raise awareness about our organization."

Non-profits also find that the DVD copy of their brochure is

effective for training and other presentations. "We found our Video Brochure DVD especially helpful," says Brenda Kidder of Liberty House Child Abuse Assessment Center, "when making community awareness presentations to a bilingual audience."

The Non-Profit Center also began filling short-term outreach niches in 2010 with event coverage and public service announcements (PSAs), among them the opening of a spay-Humane Society, highlights from which were used in their video brochure.

Northwest Human Services collaborated to created a PSA raising awareness of its Deaf and Hearing-Impaired Services, and Farmworkers Housing **Development Corporation helped** create a tutorial in English and Spanish on how to recycle. Jaime Arredondo, FHDC director, developed the project and wrote and narrated the script. "Our collaboration with CCTV has allowed us to educate the Latino community more about the howto, and the importance of waste reduction."

The Non-Profit Center takes full advantage of CCTV's two studios, new HD cameras, a new music library and audio tools, all of which add to its professional production capability.
