A well-informed, actively-involved citizenry makes more responsible decisions. CCTV televises local government meetings, activities of local schools and service-related information to stimulate an active dialogue among elected officials, schools and local citizens.

Diversity and Inclusiveness

Democracy is most effective in a society in which all members can participate. CCTV encourages understanding and collaboration across barriers of race, culture, language, class, gender and age.

Media Literacy

Community TV offers an alternative to commercial television. CCTV provides the training and tools necessary for people to become knowledgeable and effective communicators, able to view television critically and to use that medium to tell their own stories.

Making Technology Serve Our Community

Making technology serve our community

As CCTV enters its third decade and community media across the country enters its fifth, and as technology changes at an ever-increasing pace, our job remains the same: making technology serve the non-commercial, informational needs of our capital area community. Our work in 2010-2011 centered on our conversion to High Definition (HD), increased use of the web and social media, and training our community to make the changes. Here are some of the highlights.

New equipment at Salem City Council and Marion County Commission meetings

In March, CCTV put new camera and switching equipment into service at the Salem City Council Chambers and at Marion County's 1115 Commercial St NE location for Commission meetings. The new images are great! Our next step is to work with Comcast to reduce the signal loss that takes place both at CCTV and on the transmission path to Comcast in Portland and then back to our community.

Facebook, YouTube and Cristina!

In May Production Intern Cristina Martinez Gonzalez joined the CCTV staff on a two-year training program. Cristina will be learning a wide variety of production skills and will also handle CCTV's

Facebook page and YouTube video. Cristina, a resident of Madrid, studied one year at South Salem High School and brings both bilingual skills and a lot of energy to CCTV. Welcome, Cristina!

Quieter studios

In January, contractors sprayed sound insulation on the studio ceilings and down the top two feet of the walls. While we cannot eliminate sound leaving or entering the studios, this insulation has helped.

The Next Frontier: HD Channels and an HD Truck!

The next frontier is putting beautiful, HD images in the homes of our community. The City of Salem and Marion County are currently negotiating with Comcast on the next cable TV franchise. The new franchise is expected to complete the conversion of our cable system from analog to digital, and to provide HD community channels.

CCTV is also in the process of purchasing an HD production truck from the same business that built CCTV's current truck, now 21 years in service. This new truck, additional HD equipment, work on the web and work with local governments, schools, non-profit organizations and individuals are the key elements of CCTV's plan to put our community on TV and the web.


Janice Hallman, Office Specialist Trainee

November 2010 General Election Coverage Newly Extends Voter Outreach

CCTV's production truck traditionally goes on location for many election season forums and town halls, but CCTV's new studios were also busy and productive.

Planning began July 1 for an ambitious slate of ten November General Election Candidate Forums jointly sponsored by CCTV and the League of Women Voters (LWV). All candidates for Oregon Senate Districts 10 and 11, and House Districts 19, 20, 21, 22 and 25 participated. Also taking part were all candidates for Marion County Commissioner Position 1 and Polk County Commissioner Positions 2 and 3. All ten forums, recorded back-to-back in Studio One over a three-day period in September, began airing days later.

New Set, New HD Camera

Because these were the first election programs to be hosted in CCTV's new studios, producers Wendy Brokaw and Soha Badiei created a new set and lighting, enlisting Wendy's sewing and Soha's design skills. Another first: CCTV recorded its "Video Voter Guide," short candidate messages created for the channels, with one of its new high-definition cameras. Due to the increased demand for cross-over media CCTV additionally offered the Guide and all its voter services programs throughout the election season as streaming media and as YouTube links for social networking.

How to Vote and Oregon's Ballot Explained

CCTV collaborated with Marion County Elections Chief, Bill Burgess, who scripted and hosted two public service spots explaining how to register to vote, and how to navigate Oregon's newly redesigned ballot. Three LWV members explained the November General Election ballot initiatives using materials from the League's acclaimed non-partisan Voter Guide.

Warm Reception, Building Tours

Office Coordinator Heide Kizer made LWV moderators and candidates feel welcome in a beautifully appointed election-themed reception area, where they mingled and took refreshments between recordings. Many took building tours. All expressed their delight in the new studios and several wrote to express their gratitude toward CCTV and its commitment to the community.

Salem Fire Department and CCTV Team Up to Produce "EMS Chat"

During 2010 the Salem City Council allotted some money to the Salem Fire Department for the purchase of a portable internet video server (V-Brick unit) that would be used to distribute training videos to all Salem area fire stations. After they began to implement this V-Brick unit, they soon realized that they needed to produce the training videos that would be shown through this system. They already had some training videos ready to go, but there were new aspects of fire and EMS (Emergency Medical System) training that needed to be covered, and some older videos that needed to be updated. Also, they wanted the ability to do live telecasts to all of the stations, which were also interactive, where questions could be asked by the fire crews at the stations and answered on the air.

It wasn't long before Salem Fire realized the resource that existed locally here at CCTV, and approached us with the idea of working together with them on this project. Not only could we telecast live over the air and through the internet, but we also had the ability to do live call-in shows in our studios. In addition, because of our production experience and hard working volunteers, we were able to give the show a professional look that exceeded what they had originally hoped for.

The show is called EMS Chat and since we started this partnership with Salem Fire we have produced five shows as well as some other training and recruitment videos.

During this three-month period we did productions in meeting rooms, council chambers, and community centers in Silverton, Stayton, Woodburn, Keizer, Aumsville, and three of our meetings were held in the Salem-Keizer School's Boardroom. For me, the most enjoyable part of all this was traveling to these locations with, and getting to know the three volunteers that have been working on these productions for the last 15+ years, Ed Freydl, Richard Gallagher and Joe Fabbri. -- Mark

Cherry City Music Festival Coordinator, Ross Swartzendruber had a few comments too...



CCTV's Archive Library Gained 1300 Programs

CCTV produced a total of 571 new programs during the 2010-2011 fiscal year according to our archive records. CCTV producers Ken Hook, Soha Badiei, Mark Hernandez along with Wendy Brokaw created most of these programs consisting of a large array of subject matter and events pertaining to our local community.

What's more is that volunteer John Piper worked tirelessly in transferring our VHS tape archives from the 1990s to DVD format, adding another 729 programs to our now 5300 total archive library!

Once John transferred them to DVD he handed them off to Janice Hallman, our Office Specialist

trainee, who did quality-checks on each DVD. After that, Heide Kizer labeled each DVD, entered it into our database and saved it to our RAID hard drive.

Afterwards, this trio archive team worked on finding a solution to recycle the old VHS tapes. After some research we discovered that Garten Services would take the tapes and cases as long as we removed the tape reels first. So with the help of a number of other volunteers we set to work tearing apart VHS tapes. After about a week and half Charles Lewis used his truck and hauled all the recycled materials to Garten.

Last year we had over 4000 total archives and 41 boxes of DVD archives. This year we have over 5300 total archives and 51 boxes. We are very proud of the history that this represents of Salem's community and CCTV's hard work done by staff and hundreds of volunteers.





Non-Profit Center Expands, Meets Social Networking Needs

Social networking, with its challenges and rewards, quickly evolved into a necessary outreach tool and CCTV is helping non-profits use it effectively. After a successful launch in 2008, CCTV's Non-Profit Center has greatly expanded adding nearly four dozen video brochures, many in English and Spanish, with dozens more in the works.

Area non-profits are taking advantage of their three-way outreach: they are featured on CCTV Channels 21 and 23, as videos on individual web pages within CCTV's Non-Profit Center and now on CCTV's You Tube channel, where they can easily be linked to non-profit web and social networking sites.

Increasingly non-profits like Assistance League of Salem, with its nine philanthropies, are taking advantage of this option.

The Non-Profit Center began filling short-term outreach niches in 2010 with event coverage and public service announcements (PSAs), among them a Crime Mapping tutorial on behalf of the City of Salem Police Department, a PSA for Northwest Human Services, coverage of Family Building Blocks' Riverfront Family Fest, and Marion-Polk Food Share's "Food for Thought" demonstration.
